

ORDER DIRECTING PAYMENT OF DEFENDANTS' COSTS
AND RESETTING SETTLEMENT CONFERENCE

The above-entitled cause has been referred to United States Magistrate Judge Paul D. Stickney for a settlement conference to be completed by February 20, 2015. The Court set the settlement conference for February 4, 2015 at 10:00 A.M. The Court subsequently moved the settlement conference from 10:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. on the same date. However, Plaintiffs' counsel, Ms. Nadine King-Mays represented to the Court only one hour prior to the commencement of the settlement conference that she did not plan to attend the settlement conference because she believed the settlement conference was continued to a different date and that in any event, her clients would not be present because she was not able to locate them. As a result, Defendants expended resources in providing a representative who traveled from Florida for the settlement conference. Defendants are instructed to submit to the Court their costs incurred, including airfare for their representative to attend the settlement conference. Ms. King-Mays is ordered to reimburse Defendants the costs incurred for their representative being present. No attorney fees are ordered at this time, only costs of the travel, hotel and other incidentals related to the travel.

The settlement conference is hereby re-set for **THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 12, 2015, at 8:30 A.M.**, convening in Courtroom 1620, 1100 Commerce St., Dallas, Texas. Defendants are not required to have a representative personally present but Defendants are permitted to contract their representative by telephone if they so desire. However, Ms. King-Mays and her clients are ordered to be personally present for the settlement conference.
